Head Coach David Dean

David Dean is in his third season at the helm of the Valdosta State Blazers and sports an all-time record of 27-8 (.771). In 2007, Dean became just the second NCAA Division II first-year head coach to lead his team to a national title, joining North Dakota State's Earl Solomonson, while leading VSU back to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2008. He has tallied an 18-6 record (.750) in Gulf South Conference play.

Head Coach Kevin Clark

Kevin Clark is in his third year as the leader of the Edward Waters football program, having accumulated a 9-22 (.290) record with the Tigers. Overall, Clark has served as a collegiate head coach for six years and has tallied a 36-42 mark during that span.

Today's Game

Valdosta State concludes its 2009 season as the Blazers host Edward Waters in Bazemore-Hyder Stadium. The Blazers enter the game with a 5-4 record, including a 5-3 mark in Gulf South Conference play after a 31-20 win at West Georgia last week, while the Tigers are 0-9, including a 45-24 loss to Division I Savannah State in their last outing. The game is scheduled for a 2:00 p.m. kickoff.

VSU averages 405.3 yards of total offense on the season while surrendering 363.1 yards per game. Quarterback **Kellen Lewis** leads the offense as he has completed 214-of-350 passes for 2,297 yards and 12 touchdowns while also rushing for 385 yards and eight scores. Wide receiver **Cedric Jones** has caught 57 passes for 544 yards and two scores and linebacker **Larry Dean** leads the defense with 76 total tackles, including 7.5 for loss.

Edward Waters is averaging 268.1 yards per game while surrendering 389.3 per outing. Quarterback Brandon Turman leads the Tiger attack with 1,015 passing yards and six touchdowns. Rudy Wilson leads the EWC defense with 62 tackles, including six tackles for loss, and a fumble recovery.

The 2009 season marks the 28th year of Valdosta State football while the Edward Waters game will be the 320th game in school history. The Blazers have won 215 contests, lost 100 and tied four times, a winning percentage of .680.

Balance in the Receiving Corps

Valdosta State has been very balanced in receptions this season as eight players have reached double digits in catches on the year. **Cedric Jones** leads the way with 57 catches, followed by **Gerald Ford** with 39. **R.J. Bastone** has 25 receptions, **Ronnye Nelson** 24 and **Kody Case** while **Cedric Evans** has 22, **Jackson Dean** 18 and **Owen Dixon** 10. Six more players have caught at least one pass on the year.

Jones leads the way with 544 yards while Ford has 507. Bastone has tallied 413 yards on the season. Seven Blazers have caught a touchdown pass, led by Ford who has four touchdowns on the season. Jones, Bastone, Case and Evans have all caught two on the year.

In 2008, only six receivers recorded double digit receptions, led by Jones with 57, while 10 did so during the 2007 season, in which VSU played 14 games.

Jones Sets Receiving Record

Valdosta State's **Cedric Jones** became the most prolific receiver in Gulf South Conference and Valdosta State history when he caught 14 passes against Delta State on October 1. The 14 receptions gave Jones a total of 258 in his career, surpassing Sean Pender's school and league record of 247 set between 1992 and 1996. Jones now ranks seventh all-time in the NCAA Division II record books with 282 catches and is 41 behind Division II record holder Clarence Coleman of Ferris State, who caught 323 passes during his career.

Injuries Take Their Toll

Valdosta State has been victimized by the injury bug through the first half of the 2009 season as five players have suffered season ending injuries thus far. The defense has been the hardest hit by the injuries as four players, including two starters, off of the two-deep depth chart have been sidelined for the season, including **Demario Jones**, **Japree Miles**, **Rashad Etheridge** and **Brett Sudduth**. Meanwhile, **Cam Short** on the offensive line also had his season ended due to injury while **Gordon Steele** has yet to return from an injury suffered during spring conditioning.

Through the Blazers' nine games, 17 Blazers have missed games due to injury. In addition to the six players listed above, kicker **Daniel Andersen** (one game), wide receiver **Cedric Evans** (two games), offensive guard **Lance Helton** (one game), kicker **Justin Kraemer** (five games), linebacker **Ryan Smith** (one game), defensive tackle **Demetrius Bozeman** (two games) cornerback **Alex Webster** (three games), wide receiver **Chris Wellborn** (two games), wide receiver **Owen Dixon** (one game), defensive tackle **Tommie Duhart** (one game), linebacker **Demarcus Flanagan** (one game), wide receiver **Kody Case** and offensive tackle **Britt Wilson** (two games) have all missed games for VSU this year. As a group, the injured players have missed a total of 65 games this season.

Blazer Seniors to be Honored

Valdosta State will honor 20 seniors prior to Saturday's regular season finale. The group includes defensive end **Chauncey DeBose**, defensive tackle **Tommie Duhart**, cornerback **Rashad Etheridge**, quarterback **Kellen Lewis**, safety **Josh Wylie**, wide receiver **Johnny Belt**, cornerback **Devin Cannon**, linebacker **Marcel Horne**, fullback **Donnie Powell**, linebacker **Seasn Weathers**, deep snapper **Ryan Bough**, linebacker **Demarcus Flanagan**, fullback **Eric Sledge**, offensive lineman **Garrett Grady**, cornerback **Carlos Anderson**, wide receiver **R.J. Bastone**, defensive end **Melvin Black**, wide receiver **Cedric Jones** and center **Edward Gregory**.

Ford Looking Presidential

Freshman wide receiver Gerald Ford has been a pleasant surprise for Valdosta State this season as he is currently second on the team with 39 receptions and 507 receiving yards. Ford also leads the Valdosta State squad with four touchdown receptions, all of which have come in the last three weeks of the season.

Ford has caught at least five passes in four different games this season, including a career-best seven at Harding October 17. He tallied two touchdowns against North Alabama the following week before catching six passes for a personal-best 123 yards at West Georgia October 29. The highlight of his night against the Wolves came when he caught a short pass over the middle and raced 58 yards for a touchdown, the longest reception of his career.

Gulf South Conference Success

The Blazers have been among the top three in the GSC every year since 2000. Over the course of the last nine-plus seasons, Valdosta State has compiled a 74-12 (.860) record and went a perfect 9-0 in 2001, 2002 and 2004. VSU won GSC championships in 2000, 2001, 2002 and 2004.

Overall, the Blazers have gone a 149-70-3 (.678) record in GSC play and have won five conference championships, with the first coming in 1996. Valdosta State has winning records against eight of the 10 current GSC teams and boasts a 121-50-2 (.705) record against those schools.

Valdosta State's 74 GSC wins over the last nine-plus seasons are 10 more than Delta State, who is second with 64 during that time span.

Lewis Settles In

During the summer of 2009, much was made about the fact that former Indiana quarterback Kellen Lewis had transferred to Valdosta State. After all, Lewis had set 16 school records for the Hoosiers and had been named second-team All-Big Ten as a sophomore in 2007.

Lewis has done little to disappoint while wearing the Red and Black as he has started all seven games and has passed for 2,297 yards on the season. The Jacksonville, Fla. native has completed 214-of-350 passes, a 61.1 percent completion rate, and has thrown 12 touchdowns. Additionally, Lewis has carried the ball 100 times for at team-best 385 yards and eight touchdowns on the year.

Lewis earned Gulf South Conference Player of the Week honors on October 12 after leading VSU to a 33-20 victory over Henderson State the weekend before. He completed 22-of-34 passes for 314 yards and rushed for another 112 yards, accounting for 426 of Valdosta State's 530 yards of total offense in the contest. He also had a hand in all four Blazer touchdowns in the game as he ran for two and passed for two.

Lewis' comfort level has been evident over the last six weeks as he passed for 1,669 yards and 10 touchdowns, completing 148-of-245 passes in the process. He has also rushed for 365 yards and six touchdowns during that time. Lewis has accounted for 2,034 of Valdosta State's 2,448 yards of total offense in those games.

Nelson Featured in New York Times

Valdosta State **Ronny Nelson** was featured in the Sports section of the Tuesday, September 29 edition of the New York Times in a story titled "Balancing Act May Help Division II Define Itself." The article, which appeared both online and in the print edition, discussed NCAA Division II's efforts to set itself apart from Division I and III.

In the piece, author Katie Thomas discusses why certain athletes who have the ability to play on the Division I level chose to play at a Division II institution. Nelson, who was being heavily recruited by Division I programs when he tore his ACL in the 2005 Georgia Class AAA state championship game, speaks to Valdosta State tradition of winning as a reason why he chose the school.

New Face on the Sideline

Valdosta State welcomes two new coaches in 2009 as Seth Wallace takes over the secondary and special teams units from Maurice Linguist. Wallace joined VSU from Iowa, where he served as a graduate assistant the last three years. Wallace was a standout at Division III Coe College as a player and also coached at Coe as a student assistant and Lake Forest College as offensive coordinator.

Meanwhile, Robby Brown has assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Blazers. Brown played at Georgia Tech and has coached at Troy, Southwest Baptist and Henderson State.

Defense Enjoys Record Setting Night

After spending two weeks listening to skeptics upon surrendering 470 yards of total offense to Newberry in the season opener, the Valdosta State defense enjoyed one of the best nights in school history in VSU's 32-7 victory over Southern Arkansas September 12. The Blazers allowed the Muleriders just 39 yards of total offense, the second fewest surrendered by Valdosta State in a game. SAU tallied 53 passing yards in the game while being held to minus-14 yards of rushing, which tied the third fewest yards ever by a Blazer opponent. The defense surrendered just seven first downs on the evening, three of which came via penalty, which ranked sixth-best all-time and was denied a shutout when a Kellen Lewis pass was intercepted and returned 29 yards for a touchdown. Southern Arkansas ran 54 plays in the game and averaged just 0.7 yards per play.

The 39 yards of total offense by Southern Arkansas was only bested by the 22 surrendered by the Blazers to Mount Senario on September 2, 1993. Meanwhile, only Central Florida, who lost a total of 29 yards rushing on October 22, 1988, and Clark Atlanta, which finished with minus-15 yards rushing on September 24, 1994, have rushed for fewer yards in a game than did SAU.

On the year, Valdosta State is now allowing 363.1 yards of total offense per game, including 117.8 on the ground and 245.3 through the air.

The Blazers at Home

Valdosta State has won 120 of 160 games, with 38 losses and one tie (.753), on its home field since beginning football in 1982. The Blazers are an impressive 111-35-1 (.759) at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium and have gone 9-4 (.692) at Martin Stadium.

VSU has gone undefeated at home seven times (5-0 in 2006, 6-0 in 2004, 9-0 in 2002, 5-0 in 1995, 8-0 in 1994, 3-0-1 in 1992 and 5-0 in 1986) in its 27-year history. The Blazers have been particularly successful at home since the beginning of the 2000 season as they have tallied a 54-10 record (.844) during that span.

The Blazers on the Road

Valdosta State has played 157 games away from home during its 28-year history and has tallied an 95-59-3 record (.615) in those games. Since the beginning of the 2000 season, the Blazers have been even more impressive on the road, winning 49 of 59 contests (.831). In fact, only three (2006, 2008 and 2009) has VSU lost more than one road game in a season during that span.

Freshmen Filling the Holes

A bevy of freshmen are getting to see action for the Blazers this year as 13 played in the season opener against Newberry and a total of 17 have played through the first nine games. Seven of the freshman were true freshman this season while the remaining six red-shirted last year. Overall, the 2009 Valdosta State roster includes 21 freshmen.

Of the 13 freshman that played against Newberry, three started, including true freshman **Matt Pierce** at free safety, red-shirt **Alex Webster** at right corner and true freshman kicker **Daniel Anderson**.

The remaining freshmen that saw action in the season opener included wide receivers **Gerald Ford** (red-shirt) and **Rico Mack** (true) as well as right tackle **Edmond Kugbila** (true), left tackle **Mesh Wokomaty** (red-shirt) and center **Jake Thomas** (true) on offense and linebacker **Ryan Smith** (red-shirt), defensive tackle **Demetrius Bozeman** (true), defensive ends **Marcus Nedd** (red-shirt) and **Eddie Brown** (red-shirt), as well as free safety **Brett Sudduth** (red-shirt).

2009 Captains Named

In a preseason vote by the team, four juniors were named team captains by coach David Dean at the start of the season. **Larry Dean** returns for his second season as a captain and is joined by **Demario Jones**, **Ronny Nelson** and **Russ Callaway**. The quartet will be joined at midfield by two senior captains and the previous week's player of the week, as selected by the coaches, for the pregame coin toss.

On the Air

For the fourth straight season, Valdosta State will have a minimum of two games broadcast on television in 2009. Three VSU games were broadcast on the GSC TV "Game of the Week" package in 2006 while three more were shown on the GSC package in 2007. Additionally, two of the Blazers' NCAA Playoff games were shown on the ESPN family of networks.

VSU was scheduled to have three broadcasts in 2008 as well, with two coming in the GSC package and one on CBS College Sports, but a tropical storm caused the cancellation of the CBS College Sports broadcast just hours before VSU took the field.

This season, Valdosta State will play two games, at Delta State and at West Georgia, on the GSC TV "Game of the Week" package while also having its home contest against North Alabama nationally broadcast on CBS College Sports.

In addition to the televised contests, all of Valdosta State's home contests will be webcast by VSU TV. The webcasts will be available at www.vstateblazers.tv.

Blazers Among the Nations Best

In fact only three schools, Grand Valley State, Bentley and West Chester, have a better all-time winning percentage than the Blazers, whose 215-100-4 all-time record accounts for a .679 winning percentage over the history of the program. One of the Best Since the Turn of the Century

Much of the Blazers' all-time winning percentage ranking can be attributed to Valdosta State's play since the beginning of the 2000 season, as only two Division II teams have won more games during that period. The Blazers have tallied 103 wins over the course of the last nine seasons, behind only Grand Valley State's 118 and Northwest Missouri State's 108. GVSU (.907) and Tuskegee (.850) are the only teams with a better winning percentage than Valdosta State's .837. Five Selected to Preseason All-Gulf South Conference Team

Five Blazers were selected among the best in the GSC by the GSC coaches during the preseason, including two seniors and three juniors. Wide receiver **Cedric Jones** represented the VSU offensive squad while long snapper **Joey Farmer**, who was second team All-GSC following the 2008 season, was named to the special teams unit. The final three selections all came from the defensive side of the ball where linebacker **Larry Dean**, defensive tackle **Demario Jones**, both of whom earned second team All-GSC last year, and cornerback **Carlos Anderson** earned the honor. Cedric Jones and Anderson are seniors while Demario Jones, Dean and Farmer are all juniors.

Opening Day Losses a Rarity

Valdosta State's opening game loss marked the first time since the 2004 season that the Blazers lost their first game of the year. In fact, the loss marked just the 10th time in 28 years that VSU lost its first game of the year.

More surprising than the opening day loss was the fact that the Blazers dropped their home opener, an occurrence that had not occurred since the 1998 opener, in which Fort Valley State defeated the Blazers 20-14. Valdosta State had won its last 10 straight home openers and 23 of its 27 previous home openers.

Anderson Having Strong Senior Season

Senior cornerback **Carlos Anderson** is enjoying a stellar senior season as he is currently second on the Valdosta State squad with 55 tackles. The Spain Park, Ala. native has also recorded 6.0 tackles for loss and two interceptions, while breaking up a team-high four passes. He has also caused a team-best five fumbles while recovering two. A three-year letterwinner for the Blazers, Anderson has now tallied 171 tackles in his career.

Jones Enjoying Record-Breaking Senior Season

In his final year in the Red and Black, wide receiver **Cedric Jones** is enjoying a record-breaking season as he has already established a new Valdosta State and Gulf South Conference career receptions record, currently standing with 282. Jones broke the old record of 247, held by VSU's Sean Pender, with his fourth reception against Delta State October 1.

Jones, who currently leads VSU with 57 receptions on the year, has led the Blazers in receiving in each of his first three years. He burst on to the Division II scene in 2006 with 66 receptions, before catching 102 while earning All-America honors in 2007. He tallied 57 catches in 2008. His 282 career receptions currently ranks seventh on the NCAA Division II career list.

Jones is now up to second all-time at VSU and third in the GSC in receiving yards with 3,177 and has caught 21 touchdowns.

In addition to his 57 receptions, Jones also leads VSU with 544 receiving yards and has two touchdowns on the year.

Blazers Make the Point, Hold Current Consecutive Games Scoring Streak

Known for its offense, Valdosta State is the current NCAA Division II leader in games without being shutout as the Blazers have scored in each of their last 223 games. The last time VSU was shutout was on September 14, 1991 when UCF defeated the Blazers 12-0 in Orlando, Fla. Non-Conference Success

Valdosta State saw its non-conference unbeaten streak snapped at 15 games when it fell to North Alabama in the NCAA Division II playoffs to end the 2008 season. The Blazers had won its three previous non-conference games in 2008 after going 6-0 in non-league action in 2007.

Ironically, two of Valdosta State's last three non-conference losses have come against North Alabama, a fellow Gulf South Conference member. The Lions defeated the Blazers 37-10 in the second round of the playoffs last year and claimed a 40-13 victory in the first round of the 2005 playoffs.

Newberry snapped the Blazers 15-game unbeaten streak against non-Gulf South Conference opponents when it defeated the Blazers 31-24 in the 2009 season opener. Prior to that game, VSU had not lost a game to a non-GSC team since Albany State claimed a 24-22 victory over Valdosta State on September 4, 2004.

Larry Making His Mark on the Field

Now in his third season at Valdosta State, linebacker **Larry Dean** has solidified himself as one of the top linebackers in the Gulf South Conference. Dean has played in all 35 games in his Valdosta State career, starting 32 of those contests. He has finished in the top five on the team in tackles in each of his first two seasons, finishing fifth with 71 as a freshman in 2007 before tallying a team-high 95 stops last season. He has 24.5 career tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks as well as four forced fumbles and 10 passes defended. He has tallied 242 tackles in his career, just one shy of 10th place all-time at VSU.

Dean is on pace to join former Blazer great Jessie Tuggle, who owns the VSU career mark with 340 tackles, as the only Valdosta State players to tally 300 career stops, as he is only 58 away with more than a season to play. He needs just 2.0 more tackles for loss to move into that category's top 10 at VSU.

Special Teams Get Offensive

The importance Head Coach David Dean places on special teams play is evidenced by the fact that Valdosta State has blocked 14 opponent kicks over the course of the last two-plus years, including eight punts, three extra points and three field goal attempts. The Blazers have scored on six of the 13 blocks, including four touchdowns, a safety and a defensive two-point conversion.

Meanwhile, the Blazer kickoff and punt return units have scored five touchdowns off returns the last two seasons. Over all, the special teams units have accounted for 67 points off of blocks and returns in Dean's time as head coach.

Season Ticket Sales Record Broken for Second Straight Year

For the second straight year, Valdosta State enters the football season having established a new record for season ticket sales. As of Wednesday, September 9, the VSU ticket office had issued 887 season tickets, 26 more than the record of 861 set during the 2008 season. Prior to 2008, the Valdosta State record for season tickets was 711. These numbers do not include corporate sales season tickets, which brings the 2009 total to 1,837.

Valdosta State has tallied 16,427 fans through its first three home games of the year, an average of 5,416 fans per game. The Blazers opened the season with a bang as they drew 9,217 fans to the season opener against Newberry.

Blazers Picked to Finish Third in the Gulf South Conference

The Gulf South Conference coaches picked Valdosta State to finish third in the league in 2009, in a vote conducted during the 2009 preseason. Delta State, which has won the conference each of the last two years, was selected to three-peat, finishing with 96 votes while North Alabama came in second with 88 votes. The Blazers, who tallied two first place votes, were one vote behind UNA at 87 followed by Arkansas-Monticello (72), Arkansas Tech (59), Henderson State (52), Ouachita Baptist (43), West Alabama (40), Harding (26), Southern Arkansas (23) and West Georgia (19).

Poll Streak Ends At 124 Weeks

The September 21, 2009 edition of the American Football Coaches Association Division II poll featured the first time Valdosta State has not been ranked since the preseason poll prior to the 2000 season. The AFCA has 132 polls overall, meaning VSU has missed only seven polls appearances. Behind the Blazers, Pittsburg State has been in 123 polls, Northwest Missouri State 122, Grand Valley State 120 and Carson-Newman 118.

Holding Down the Top Spot

Of the 124 times that VSU has appeared in the AFCA poll, it has held the No. 1 spot 20 weeks, the second-most appearances at No. 1 among Division II schools. Grand Valley State holds the record of 78 weeks at No. 1 while Northwest Missouri State is the only other school in double figures with 12.

Lewis Named GSC Offensive Player of the Week

Kellen Lewis became the first Blazer to earn Gulf South Conference Player of the Week honors when he earned the league's offensive honor on October 12. Lewis was honored after leading Valdosta State to a 33-20 victory over Henderson State, a game in which he accounted for 426 of VSU's 530 yards of total offense in the game.

Lewis completed 22-of-34 passes for 314 yards, his third straight 300-yard passing game, in the contest while rushing the ball 18 times for 112 yards. He had a hand in all four of Valdosta State's touchdowns in the game as he ran for scores of six and 20 yards while throwing touchdowns of 18 and 17 yards.

Lewis is the first offensive player from Valdosta State to earn GSC Player of the Week honors since Michael Terry did so on September 29, 2007.

Southern Arkansas' only score of the game came when Lewis' arm was hit while attempting a pass ... Keldrick Johnson ran for 144 yards in the game, snapping a streak of 20 straight games in which an opposing running back had not reached triple digits against VSU ... Meanwhile, Jeremy Young caught 13 passes for 261 yards and two touchdowns ... He scored on passes of 56 and 60 yards ... After Jason Fowler kicked a 35-yard first quarter field goal and seen a 33-yard attempt blocked by the Blazers, **Ronnye Nelson** gave VSU its only lead of the game on a three-yard touchdown run in the second quarter ... The Tigers responded just two and a half minutes later when Johnson scored on a 45-yard run for a 10-7 Quachita Baptist halftime lead ...
