Head Coach David Dean

David Dean is in his third season at the helm of the Valdosta State Blazers and sports an all-time record of 22-5 (.815). In 2007, Dean became just the second NCAA Division II first-year head coach to lead his team to a national title, joining North Dakota State's Earl Solomonson, while leading VSU back to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2008. He has tallied a 13-3 record (.813) in Gulf South Conference play.

Bill Keopple is in his first year as the head coach at Southern Arkansas. Keopple, who also serves as the offensive coordinator for the Muleriders, spent the last six years as head coach at Texarkana High School and has served as an assistant coach at Tulsa, Arkansas, Boise State and Central Arkansas.

Today's Game

Valdosta State looks to rebound from its opening season loss as the Blazers host Southern Arkansas in Bazemore-Hyder Stadium. The game marks the Gulf South Conference opener for both schools, although SAU's season opener was against North Alabama, a non-league contest.

Valdosta State is coming off of a 31-24 loss to Newberry, the Blazers' first loss in a season opener since the 2004 season. Meanwhile, UNA defeated Southern Arkansas 41-9 in the Muleriders' season opener.

VSU compiled 411 yards of total offense against Newberry, but surrendered 470 total yards, including 333 through the air. Running back **Ronnye Nelson** led the offense as he picked up 25 yards on eight rushes while also catching a team-high six passes for 46 yards. Wide receiver **Cedric Jones** tallied four receptions and 72 yards while **Larry Dean** and **Ratu Rabelo** tallied 10 tackles each to pace the defensive unit.

Southern Arkansas returns 34 letterwinners and 14 starters, including nine on offense and five on defense, off of its 2008 squad. The Muleriders tallied just 127 yards of total offense against North Alabama in their season opener, while allowing the Lions 381 total yards. SAU passed for 87 yards and threw for another 83 in the contest. Quarterback Ryan McCombie led the offense as he rushed for 19 yards on 11 carries while passing for 66 yards. Cedric Thornton and Maurice Thornton paced the defense with nine tackles each.

The 2009 season marks the 28th year of Valdosta State football while the Southern Arkansas game will be the 312th game in school history. The Blazers have won 210 contests, lost 97 and tied four times, a winning percentage of .682.

The Blazers at Home

Valdosta State has won 117 of 156 games, with 38 losses and one tie (.753), on its home field since beginning football in 1982. The Blazers are an impressive 108-34-1 (.759) at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium and have gone 9-4 (.692) at Martin Stadium.

VSU has gone undefeated at home seven times (5-0 in 2006, 6-0 in 2004, 9-0 in 2002, 5-0 in 1995, 8-0 in 1994, 3-0-1 in 1992 and 5-0 in 1986) in its 27-year history and were 5-1 at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium last season, falling only to Delta State.

The Blazers have been particularly successful at home since the beginning of the 2000 season as they have tallied a 51-9 record (.850) during that span.

Gulf South Conference Success

The Blazers have been among the top three in the GSC every year since 2000. Over the course of the last eight-plus seasons, Valdosta State has compiled a 68-9 (.883) record and went a perfect 9-0 in 2001, 2002 and 2004. VSU won GSC championships in 2000, 2001, 2002 and 2004.

Overall, the Blazers have gone a 144-67-3 (.680) record in GSC play and have won five conference championships, with the first coming in 1996. Valdosta State has winning records against eight of the 10 current GSC teams and boasts a 116-47-2 (.710) record against those schools.

Valdosta State's 69 GSC wins over the last eight seasons are nine more than Delta State, who is second with 60 during that time span.

Opening Day Losses a Rarity

Valdosta State's opening game loss marked the first time since the 2004 season that the Blazers lost their first game of the year. In fact, the loss marked just the 10th time in 28 years that VSU lost its first game of the year.

More surprising than the opening day loss was the fact that the Blazers dropped their home opener, an occurrence that had not occurred since the 1998 opener, in which Fort Valley State defeated the Blazers 20-14. Valdosta State had won its last 10 straight home openers and 23 of its 27 previous home openers.

Freshmen to Play Early, Often

A bevy of freshmen are getting to see action for the Blazers this year as 13 played in the season opener against Newberry. Seven of the freshman are true freshman this season while the remaining six red-shirted last year. Overall, the 2009 Valdosta State roster includes 21 freshmen.

Of the 13 freshman that played against Newberry, three started, including true freshman **Matt Pierce** at free safety, red-shirt **Alex Webster** at right corner and true freshman kicker **Daniel Anderson**.

The remaining freshmen that saw action in the season opener included wide receivers **Gerald Ford** (red-shirt) and **Rico Mack** (true) as well as right tackle **Edmond Kugbila** (true), left tackle **Mesh Wokomaty** (red-shirt) and center **Jake Thomas** (true) on offense and linebacker **Ryan Smith** (red-shirt), defensive ends **Marcus Nedd** (red-shirt) and **Eddie Brown** (red-shirt) as well as free safety **Brett Sudduth** (red-shirt).

Opposing Rushers Finding the Going Tough

Valdosta State has made life tough on opposing rushers over the course of the last two seasons as only once has an opponent rushed for more than 100 yards against VSU since Joe Cauthen became VSU's defensive coordinator. West Alabama's Terry Allen broke the century mark after having 124 yards on October 20, 2007. The Black Swarm defense has now gone 19 games without allowing an opposing player to reach triple digits in rushing. The closest an opposing came to the triple digit mark in 2008 was the 83 yards put up by Mike McLendon of North Alabama on October 25, a game in which he rushed for 101 yards in the first half before losing 18 yards in the second.

New Face on the Sideline

Valdosta State welcomes two new coaches in 2009 as Seth Wallace takes over the secondary and special teams units from Maurice Linguist. Wallace joined VSU from Iowa, where he served as a graduate assistant the last three years. Wallace was a standout at Division III Coe College as a player and also coached at Coe as a student assistant and Lake Forest College as offensive coordinator.

Meanwhile, Robby Brown has assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Blazers. Brown played at Georgia Tech and has coached at Troy, Southwest Baptist and Henderson State.

Poll Streak Alive and Well - 123 and Counting

The September 7, 2009 preseason edition of the American Football Coaches Association Division II poll featured the 123rd straight week that Valdosta State has been ranked, the longest active streak in the nation.

The AFCA began its weekly poll with the preseason poll prior to the 2000 season. Since that time it has conducted 124 polls, meaning the only poll that the Blazers have not been ranked in was the very first preseason poll, dated August 29, 2000. The Blazers entered the rankings the following week after defeating No. 12 Fort Valley State 46-0.

Behind the Blazers, Pittsburg State has been in 121 polls while Carson-Newman and Northwest Missouri State have been listed 114 times each and Grand Valley State 112.

Holding Down the Top Spot

Of the 123 times that VSU has appeared in the AFCA poll, it has held the No. 1 spot 20 weeks, the second-most appearances at No. 1 among Division II schools. Grand Valley State holds the record of 75 weeks at No. 1 while Northwest Missouri State is the only other school in double figures with 12.

2009 Captains Named

In a preseason vote by the team, four juniors were named team captains by coach David Dean at the start of the season. **Larry Dean** returns for his second season as a captain and is joined by **Demario Jones**, **Ronnye Nelson** and **Russ Callaway**. The quartet will be joined at midfield by two senior captains and the previous week's player of the week, as selected by the coaches, for the pregame coin toss.

The Valdosta State defense held the Muleriders scoreless for the second and third quarters ... **Chris Hart** threw four of VSU's five touchdown passes while **Albert Dukes** hauled in two, including a 63-yard score, in the third quarter ... The Blazers had a season-low 32 yards on penalties ... **T.J. Williams** got VSU on the board with a 35-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter while **P.J. Curbeam** collected his first career scoring reception in the second to give VSU a 17-10 halftime lead ... **Isaiah Jupiter** finished the scoring with his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter ... The Blazers managed just 11 rushing yards in the game, but passed for 318 yards ... Meanwhile the Muleriders gained 151 on the ground and 137 through the air ... Valdosta State lost the turnover battle as it threw two interceptions and lost two fumbles while recovering three Southern Arkansas fumbles ... For the second straight game, 11 VSU players caught a pass.

In fact only three schools, Grand Valley State, Bentley and West Chester, have a better all-time winning percentage than the Blazers, whose 210-97-4 all-time record accounts for a .682 winning percentage over the history of the program. One of the Best Since the Turn of the Century

Much of the Blazers' all-time winning percentage ranking can be attributed to Valdosta State's play since the beginning of the 2000 season, as only two Division II teams have won more games during that period. The Blazers have tallied 98 wins over the course of the last nine seasons, behind only Grand Valley State's 110 and Northwest Missouri State's 99. GVSU (.909) and Tuskegee (.857) are the only teams with a better winning percentage than Valdosta State's .852. Five Selected to Preseason All-Gulf South Conference Team

Five Blazers were selected among the best in the GSC by the GSC coaches during the preseason, including two seniors and three juniors. Wide receiver **Cedric Jones** represented the VSU offensive squad while long snapper **Joey Farmer**, who was second team All-GSC following the 2008 season, was named to the special teams unit. The final three selections all came from the defensive side of the ball where linebacker **Larry Dean**, defensive tackle **Demario Jones**, both of whom earned second team All-GSC last year, and cornerback **Carlos Anderson** earned the honor. Cedric Jones and Anderson are seniors while Demario Jones, Dean and Farmer are all juniors.

The Blazers on the Road

Valdosta State has played 153 games away from home during its 27-year history and has tallied an 93-57-3 record (.618) in those games. Since the beginning of the 2000 season, the Blazers have been even more impressive on the road, winning 47 of 55 contests (.855). In fact, only twice (2006, 2008) has VSU lost more than one road game in a season during that span.

The Blazers were a perfect 4-2 on the road in 2008, with wins at Newberry, West Alabama, Henderson State and Southern Arkansas. Both losses came at North Alabama, once during the regular season and once in the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Blazers in the Pros

Maurice Leggett, who played at Valdosta State from 2004 through 2007, is the only Blazer currently active in the NFL or CFL. Leggett, who is in his second season with the Kansas City Chiefs, is listed as the Chiefs' back-up at left corner as of August 24. Leggett, who signed a free agent contract with the Chiefs following the 2007 season, won the team's Mack Lee Hill Award as the club's top rookie following the 2008 season, becoming the only undrafted player to ever win the award.

On the Air

For the fourth straight season, Valdosta State will have a minimum of two games broadcast on television in 2009. Three VSU games were broadcast on the GSC TV "Game of the Week" package in 2006 while three more were shown on the GSC package in 2007. Additionally, two of the Blazers' NCAA Playoff games were shown on the ESPN family of networks.

VSU was scheduled to have three broadcasts in 2008 as well, with two coming in the GSC package and one on CBS College Sports, but a tropical storm caused the cancellation of the CBS College Sports broadcast just hours before VSU took the field.

This season, Valdosta State will play two games, at Delta State and at West Georgia, on the GSC TV "Game of the Week" package while also having its home contest against North Alabama nationally broadcast on CBS College Sports.

In addition to the televised contests, all of Valdosta State's home contests will be webcast by VSU TV. The webcasts will be available at www.vstateblazers.tv.

Jones Seeks Stellar, Record-Breaking Senior Season

Entering his final year in the Red and Black, wide receiver **Cedric Jones** looks to finish his career in grand style in 2009 as he has the opportunity to set records for career receptions and yardage. Jones currently needs just 19 receptions and 1,033 yards to become the VSU and Gulf South Conference leader in both of those career marks.

Jones burst on to the Division II scene in 2006 when he led the Blazers with 66 receptions and 911 yards, while hauling in eight touchdowns. He earned All-America honors in 2007 as he once again led the team with 102 catches and 1,171 yards while also catching a team-high 10 touchdowns. Jones saw his receptions fall to 57 in 2008, a number that once again paced the Blazers, for 551 and one touchdown.

Jones needs just seven more receptions to enter the NCAA career list and needs 906 yards to join that NCAA record list.

Blazers Make the Point, Hold Current Consecutive Games Scoring Streak

Known for its offense, Valdosta State is the current NCAA Division II leader in games without being shutout as the Blazers have scored in each of their last 215 games. The last time VSU was shutout was on September 14, 1991 when UCF defeated the Blazers 12-0 in Orlando, Fla. Non-Conference Success

Valdosta State saw its non-conference unbeaten streak snapped at 15 games when it fell to North Alabama in the NCAA Division II playoffs to end the 2008 season. The Blazers had won its three previous non-conference games in 2008 after going 6-0 in non-league action in 2007.

Ironically, Valdosta State's last two non-conference losses have come against North Alabama, a fellow Gulf South Conference member. The Lions defeated the Blazers 37-10 in the second round of the playoffs last year and claimed a 40-13 victory in the first round of the 2005 playoffs.

Overall, Valdosta State has won its last 15 games against non-GSC opponents, a string that stretches back to the opening game of the 2004 season when Albany State claimed a 24-22 victory on September 4.

Larry Making His Mark on the Field

Now in his third season at Valdosta State, linebacker **Larry Dean** has solidified himself as one of the top linebackers in the Gulf South Conference. Dean has played in all 27 games over the course of the last two years, starting 24 of those contests. He has finished in the top five on the team in tackles both seasons, finishing fifth with 71 as a freshman in 2007 before tallying a team-high 95 stops last season. He has 18.0 career tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks as well as four forced fumbles and six passes broken up. He has 176 tackles in his career.

Should Dean continue his average of 83 tackles per season over the course of the rest of his career, he will become just the second Blazer to tally 300 career stops, joining former VSU great Jessie Tuggle, who owns the Valdosta State career mark with 340 tackles. He needs just 67 more tackles to move into the VSU career top 10 while 8.5 more tackles for loss will move him into that category's top 10.

Special Teams Get Offensive

The importance Head Coach David Dean places on special teams play is evidenced by the fact that Valdosta State has blocked 11 opponent kicks over the course of the last two years, including six punts, three extra points and two field goal attempts. The Blazers have scored on six of the 11 blocks, including four touchdowns, a safety and a defensive two-point conversion.

Meanwhile, the Blazer kickoff and punt return units have scored five touchdowns off returns the last two seasons. Over all, the special teams units have accounted for 67 points off of blocks and returns.

Season Ticket Sales Record Broken for Second Straight Year

For the second straight year, Valdosta State enters the football season having established a new record for season ticket sales. As of Thursday, August 27, the VSU ticket office had issued 868 season tickets, seven more than the record of 861 set during the 2008 season. Prior to 2008, the Valdosta State record for season tickets was 711. These numbers do not include corporate sales season tickets, which brings the 2009 total to 1,810.

Blazers Picked to Finish Third in the Gulf South Conference

The Gulf South Conference coaches picked Valdosta State to finish third in the league in 2009, in a vote conducted during the 2009 preseason. Delta State, which has won the conference each of the last two years, was selected to three-peat, finishing with 96 votes while North Alabama came in second with 88 votes. The Blazers, who tallied two first place votes, were one vote behind UNA at 87 followed by Arkansas-Monticello (72), Arkansas Tech (59), Henderson State (52), Ouachita Baptist (43), West Alabama (40), Harding (26), Southern Arkansas (23) and West Georgia (19).
